COPYRIGHT ELECTRONIC USE SURVEY FOR SCHOOLS

- The records kept by schools during the EUS surveys will determine payments to the creators and ultimately encourage the making of new teaching resources.
- Schools will only have to participate in an EUS survey approximately once every eight years.

COPYRIGHT ELECTRONIC USE SURVEY FOR SCHOOLS

Schools and Copyright Licences

The Departments of Education representing Government Schools, and the Catholic and Independent School sectors (Schools) across Australia negotiate copyright licence agreements with the collecting societies, including the Copyright Agency Limited (CAL). These licences allow Schools to copy portions of copyright works for educational purposes. As part of the copyright licences administered by CAL, Schools are required to undertake a sampling survey and pay licence fees for the use of materials.

The licence fees collected by CAL are distributed to the copyright owners (as indicated by survey results).

The Electronic Use Licence

Recently the licence administered by CAL was extended to allow schools to use material electronically. The new electronic use licence applies to

- copying text from electronic form, such as from a CD-ROM or a website
- making electronic or digital copies of hard copy print, eg scanning parts of a textbook
- communicating text by electronic means, eg via email, intranet or a secure website.

Why have an Electronic Use Survey (EUS)?

The survey will be used to determine the overall level of use by schools and to enable licence fees collected to be distributed to owners of the copyright materials.

What does the EUS survey record?

The EUS survey only records electronic copying and communication undertaken by staff for educational purposes and does not include:

- electronic copying by students for their own study purposes
- copying by staff for their own private use.

How does the EUS work?

Research agency AMR Interactive will oversee the EUS survey system in schools.

The EUS surveys will be conducted in only 10 to 30 schools at any one time to enable the research agency to provide a high level of support to each school.

The EUS survey requires users of copyright material in sampled schools to keep records during the survey period. Only schools involved in the sample survey are required to keep records. This means that all other schools throughout Australia are relieved from keeping any records.

Only a small proportion of schools across Australia will be randomly selected to participate in the EUS sampling surveys every year. After participating in a survey, a school will not be chosen again for approximately eight years.

Is there an alternative to sampling?

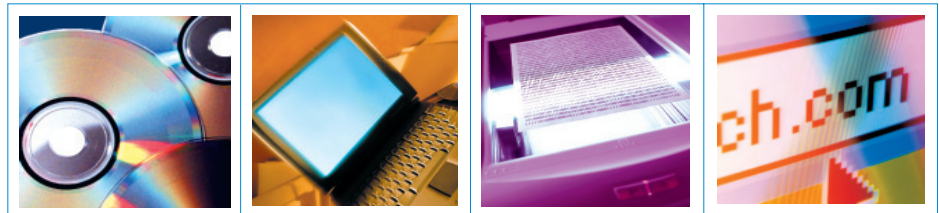
The alternative to sampling would be for all schools to maintain records of use every day, all year, every year. The School sectors would prefer to avoid this alternative.

How was my school chosen?

The number of secondary and primary schools from each of the School sectors and from each State and Territory was determined and schools were randomly selected. Where a school services both primary and secondary students only one area will be surveyed.

What do I have to do?

As a teacher in a school involved in an EUS survey (or as a member of staff who copies /communicates materials on behalf of a teacher) you are required to record your electronic use of copyright material over a period of four weeks. To do this, you simply log onto an online system, at least weekly, to record your usage or declare a nil return.
